A Study of Mormonism

With Steps to Recovery - Finding The Real Jesus

Preface

I think we can agree that it is important to take an open-minded clinical approach to research that's based upon facts you have personally and independently validated as true, and I encourage you to do just that. So, the question becomes, what is truth? Can truth be absolute?

Truth is defined as *"the belief that something has the attribute, quality, or characteristic of being in accord* [or agrees] *with fact or reality."* Facts and reality are determined by what "is" vs. what "ought" to be. For example, the property of gravity "is". It's a physical law that can be scientifically and conclusively proven.

I think we can agree that determining facts and reality require indisputable evidence that supports a conclusion, and that conclusions are based upon the likelihood of something being true based upon deductive reasoning of available facts. Ultimately, through this process, we can find the truth. But is there such a thing as absolute truth?

Yes, absolute truth can be observed in many areas of science. Gravity for example is one of the four known fundamental forces of the universe. We can't live on Earth without it. The sun's gravity keeps Earth in orbit around it while maintaining us at a comfortable distance to enjoy the sun's light and warmth. It holds down our atmosphere along with the air we need to breathe. Gravity is literally what holds our world together.

So, can the principle as absolute truth exist in theology? Could there be one true God, or are there many gods? Does God exist in the first place? How would you arrive at the correct conclusion? Philosophical opinions are in abundance, and have led to the creation of cults, new religions, or variations of an existing religion by an influential and often charismatic leader.

The Judeo-Christian church's history started in 33 A.D. after the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Christian denominations like the Eastern and Western Orthodox churches maintain intrinsic Christian Biblical doctrines, but have elected to interject manmade creeds, rituals and practices not found in scripture.ⁱ On October 31, 1517, Martin Luther, a monk, and professor of theology at the University of Wittenberg, circulated his 95 theses or statements critiquing what he saw as teachings that led Christians astray.

Luther was responsible for what became the Protestant Reformation. Protestant Christian churches strictly adhere to mainstream canons of Christianity as they were originally taught during the time of Jesus. They acknowledge Judeo-Christian Bible, and recognize that there are no new prophets, prophecies, or revelations after the Apostolic period. Jesus himself said that "many false prophets will arise and will mislead many."ⁱⁱ The Apostle Peter wrote that during their current time as well as in the future that "false prophets also arose among the people, just as there will also be false teachers among

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you, who will secretly introduce destructive heresies, even denying the Master who bought them, bringing swift destruction upon themselves."ⁱⁱⁱ Joseph Smith Jr. is one of these false prophets. Remember, Satan can disguise himself as an angel of light.^{iv}

A Brief History of Mormonism

The year 1820 proved to be the real beginning of Joseph Smith Jr. and what the Church of Jesus Christ Latter Day Saints (LDS) believe was his "prophet's call". In that year, at 15 years of age, he was allegedly the recipient of a marvelous vision in which God the Father and God the Son materialized and spoke to young Smith as he piously prayed in a neighboring wood. The prophet records the incident in great detail in his book (*The Pearl of Great Price* Joseph Smith—History 1:1–25). He recounts that the two "personages" took a rather dim view of the Christian church, and for that matter of the world at large, announced that a restoration of true Christianity was needed, and that he, Joseph Smith Jr., had been chosen to launch the new dispensation:

"I saw a pillar of light exactly over my head, above the brightness of the sun, which descended gradually until it fell upon me.....When the light rested upon me I saw two Personages, whose brightness and glory defy all description,One of them spake unto me, callin me by name and said, pointing to the other—This is My Beloved Son. Hear Him....I asked the Personages who stood above me in the light, which of all the sects was right....and which I should join....I was answered that I must join none of them, for they were all wrong; and the Personage who addressed me said that their creeds were an abomination in his sight; that those professors were all corrupt...". (Pearl of Great Price, Joseph Smith-History 1:17-19)

During this same period Joseph Jr. was also becoming proficient in "Peep" stones. This was in part thanks to the traveling Magician who was looking for buried treasure with the help of his "Peep" stones. After time no treasure was found and the magician left town, but Smith had picked up his skills. And Joseph claim to use the "Peep" stones to locate some tools. Joseph acquired a reputation and was hired by Josiah Stoal of Chenango county in New York State who heard about Joseph divining capabilities. Some of the details are recorded in *Pearl of Great Price* - Joseph Smith History:

In the year 1823 my father's family met with a great affliction by the death of my eldest brother, Alvin. In the month of October 1825, I hired with an old gentleman by the name of Josiah Stoal, who lived in Chenango county, State of New York. He had heard something of a silver mine having been opened by the Spaniards in Harmony, Susquehanna county, State of Pennsylvania; and had, previous to my hiring to him, been digging, in order if possible, to discover the mine. After I went to live with him, he took me with the rest of his hands to dig for the silver mine, at which I continued to work for nearly a month, without success in our undertaking, and finally I prevailed with the gentleman to cease digging after it. Hence arose the very prevalent story of my having been a money –digger. During the time that I was thus employed, I was put to board with a Mr. Isaac Hale, of that place; it was there I first saw my wife (his daughter), Emma Hale. On the 18th of January 1827 we were married, while I was yet employed in the service of Mr. Stoal.......(Pearl of Great Price, Joseph Smith History 1:55-57)

Ideas regarding seer stones were likely taken from *The Magus* written by Francis Barrett and first published in 1801^v. Between about 1815 and 1840, the use of "Seer" stones was popular in New York,

Pennsylvania, and some surrounding areas. By the 1850s, usage had become less common and after 1880 they had virtually disappeared from the public conscience.

The primary use for the "Peep" or "Seer" stones was to find buried treasure, and Joseph used the brown Seer stone for this purpose. This stone was used by placing it at the bottom of a white top hat and using one's hands to block light from coming in around the sides of the rim. When used in this manner, Joseph claimed that he could see things on the stone. Between approximately 1822 and 1827, Joseph worked in the company of several different groups digging on about 18 different properties in search of gold, silver, a chest of watches, and other treasures.^{vi} Joseph Smith was considered particularly skilled at the art, and received a relatively high wage for his skill. He was employed, by among others, Josiah Stowell.^{vii}

Although no treasure was found, Josiah was a believer in Joseph Smith Jr. and his abilities, and testified on his behalf when Smith who was brought to trial for these "Seer" activities by Josiah's sons who felt that their father was being defrauded. The use of Seer and Peep stones and other magical objects to find missing items was against state laws in New York. According to the court records in 1826, when he was brought to trial for his usage of the Seer stones to try to find buried treasure, it was found that he often "knew all too well" where these objects were located.

Despite court records of Smith's arrests for using Seer stones, Mormon historians have avoided every indication that Joseph Smith Jr. owned or used them. There are numerous Mormon church-based rebuttals suggesting Joseph Smith Jr. was not involved in any use of Seer stones or divination activities, and that these "stories" were contrived to discredit him. D. Michael Quinn's book^{viii} confirms Smith's use of them and includes photographs of actual Seer stones owned by Joseph Smith Jr.. It should be noted that D. Quinn was excommunicated from the LDS Church, in 1993, after refusing to keep silent about this and other unflattering research about Joseph Smith Jr. and the Mormons.

In 1823, when Joseph Smith Jr. was 18 years old, he claimed to meet the angel Nephi, later reported as named Moroni the glorified son of one Mormon, the one for whom the famous book of the name is entitled. Moroni is said to have appeared to Joseph three times, telling him to find Gold Plates on a hill in Palmyra, but he had to wait 4 years before taking them. Smith says that the angel sternly warned him not to show the plates to anybody.

Smith claims the angel Moroni delivered plates to him on September 22nd, 1827, when Joseph went to the hill called Cumorah in Palmyra New York as instructed by the angel. From 1827 to 1829 Joseph Smith was involved in translating the Gold Plates, which he said were written in "Reformed Egyptian". Along with the Plates, Joseph received from the angel "Seer" stones, the Urim, the Thummim, and the breastplate which would allow him to translate the "Reformed Egyptian" into the Book of Mormon.

After Joseph Smith Jr. and Emma Hale eloped in fall of 1827 they returned to her parent's home to retrieve her possessions. Her father Isaac Hale accused Joseph of stealing his daughter; Joseph asked for his forgiveness and promised to lead a more honest life. Isaac offered the couple a small house on his property.

Rather than helping on the farm, Joseph remained indoors. One day when his father-in-law stopped by the house to investigate, he found Joseph sitting at a table with a hat over his face uttering long Biblical

passages. He found his daughter Emma sitting behind a curtain writing down the words Joseph spoke. On the table in front of Joseph lay a square object concealed by a cloth. When Joseph removed his hat, Isaac could see the "Seer" stones were similar to the ones Joseph used to attempt to locate the buried "Spanish Treasure".

Emma's father Isaac demanded an explanation from his son-in-law. Joseph explained his vision of the angel in Palmyra, which alarmed him even more about their proceedings. Isaac asked to see the Gold Plates, and Joseph explained to him that for anybody but himself to look on the plates would mean certain death. Isaac felt certain there were no plates and Joseph was involved in an elaborate fraud.

One of Joseph's supporters, Martin Harris, mortgaged his house to support the Golden Plates translation effort. Afterward, Harris's wife, who considered Joseph Smith Jr. a fraud, left her husband. Martin Harris, claimed to have taken Smith's "Reformed Egyptian" and its translation to Professor Charles Anton in New York City, and there received confirmation to the correct translation of the "Reformed Egyptian" on the Gold Plates. Joseph Smith Jr., quotes Martin Harris's account in the *Pearl of Great Price*:

"I went to the city of New York, and presented the characters which had been translated, with the translation thereof, to Professor Charles Anthon, a gentleman celebrated for his literary attainments. Professor Anthon stated that the translation was correct, more so than any he had before seen translated from the Egyptian. I then showed him those which were not yet translated, and he said that they were Egyptian, Chaldaic, Assyriac, and Arabic; and he said they were true characters." (Pearl of Great Price...Joseph Smith-History 1: 64a)

On February 17, 1834, this claim by Martin Harris was strongly refuted by Professor Charles Anthon himself. Anton confirmed he met a "simple-hearted farmer who called upon him with a note from Dr. Mitchell requesting me to decipher" a paper^{ix}. He further comments that "I soon came to the conclusion that it was all a trick, perhaps a hoax." Anthon saw the whole thing as means to cheat the farmer (Martin Harris) of his money:

"I received this morning your favor of the 9th instant, and lose no time in making a reply. The whole story about my having pronounced the Mormonite inscription to be "reformed Egyptian hieroglyphics" is perfectly false.... I began to regard it as part of a scheme to cheat the farmer of his money, and I communicated my suspicions to him, warning him to beware of rogues." (continue reading his letter...)

Despite this opposition to the claim that Joseph Smith Jr. translated "Reformed Egyptian" from Gold Plates that no one else saw, he writes this alleged statement coming from God in *Documents and Covenants*:

"Wherefore, I the Lord, knowing the calamity which should come upon the inhabitants of the earth, called upon my servant Joseph Smith, Jr. and spake unto him from heaven, and gave him commandments....And having received the record of the Nephites, yea, even my servant Joseph Smith, Jun,. might have power to translate through the mercy of God, by the power of God, the Book of Mormon....to lay the foundation of this church, and bring it forth out of obscurity....the only true and living church upon the face of the whole earth, with which I, the Lord, am well pleased..." (Doctrine and Covenants 1:17,29,30)

In the Summer of 1828 Emma gave birth to a son who died a few hours later and led her to depression. After this, Oliver Cowdery replaced Emma as scribe, and in 1830, the plate translation work was finally completed. Joseph Smith Jr. was now 24 years old. The Book of Mormon totaled 275,000 words. Once the translation was complete, Smith claimed the angel Moroni took the Golden-Plates back to heaven. The Book of Mormon was sent to the Palmyra printers on March 25th, 1830, and placed on sale in the Palmyra Bookstores. The Rochester Newspapers reviewed the book under the headlines: "Blasphemy"!

Joseph Smith Jr started his first congregation after the Book of Mormon was published. His first converts to baptize in Lake Seneca included his parents and brothers. Joseph and Emma traveled back to her parents' neighborhood in the Susquehanna Valley where they made some converts. But they did not convert any of his former associates in treasure-hunting. Joseph's father-in-law, Isaac Hale, thought that Joseph was the same charlatan as before and never converted. With the encouragement of the locals, Joseph was once more put on trial on the charge of "disorderly conduct" by a local Presbyterian minister. After the trial, Joseph and Emma left the Susquehanna Valley where she never saw her parents again.

By the early fall of 1830 Joseph had a holdout who had still not joined his church – his wife Emma. No one knows why Emma refused to join Joseph's church, or whether she believed in the existence of the Golden Plates or the translation. It was obviously embarrassing for Joseph to be proselytizing for his new church while he was unable to win the soul of his own wife. Under considerable pressure from Joseph, the original recorder of the Book of Mormon's first words finally became a Mormon herself.^x

The membership of the Mormon church significantly increased in 1831 when a preacher in Kirtland, Ohio, converted and took his entire congregation with him into the Mormons. The church in Kirtland grew so rapidly that it became the largest center of Mormons in the country. Joseph and his elders moved the headquarters of the new national church to Kirtland where Joseph exerted a tight control over his rapidly expanding movement. Joseph announced new policies for the church as revelations which he claimed to receive directly from God.

The church split up due to disagreements over polygamy and pedophilia which was widely practiced in the Mormon Church. Several of Brigham Young's 55 wives were as young as 15, and Joseph Smith's 26th wife had been 14 at the time they were "sealed for eternity." Many of the older wives of Mormon patriarchs were also concurrently married to more than one living husband, which also struck onlookers as sacrilegious.

Hostility over this practice was a major driver of the Mormon expansion westward. Practitioners fled to the remote territory they called Deseret, where they could continue in peace. By the end of the 1880s, as it became obvious that Deseret was being organized into the State of Utah, then-Mormon President Woodruff had a revelation from God to abandon plural marriage "in obeyance to the law of the land."

Not every Mormon accepted Woodruff's revelation. To this day, several splinter factions operate more or less underground and adhere closely to the old polygamist ways. The Fundamentalist Church of Jesus Christ still exists today, despite its leader, Warren Jeffs, being sentenced to life in prison in 2011 for

sexually assaulting two minors, one of whom was 11 when she was sealed to Jeffs who was then 49 years old.

When the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints was formally organized in New York in 1830, it professed the highest of goals: to teach and promote their version of the Gospel of Jesus. From the very start of Mormon history, however, LDS church members found themselves involved in one violent confrontation after another with their neighbors, whom they referred to as "gentiles." It wasn't long before the first church adherents had to move their group several times.

The Mormon Wars, otherwise known as the Utah War or Mormon rebellion, occurred from March 1857 to July 1858. Tensions between followers of the Latter-Day Saint movement (Mormons) and Protestant Americans had simmered for two decades, including intense violent conflicts led by Rice Atchison as the militia general in the 1838 Mormon War (a.k.a. Missouri Mormon War). This conflict resulted in the death Joseph Smith Jr. in 1844. The Illinois Mormon War from 1844-1846 resulted in the Mormon Exodus to the Utah Territory under the leadership of Brigham Young who took over for Smith upon his death.^{xi}

These violent conflicts stem from a largely repeating pattern where LDS members form an insular community somewhere; buy and sell principally with each other, dominate the local economy, and the political scene. Then this is followed by harassment and violence from the area's prior residents who disagreed to Mormon doctrines and rampant polygamy. This led to guerrilla warfare, which led to the expulsion of the Mormons to a new territory where it all starts all over again. Eventually they finally settled in the territory that became the state of Utah.^{xii}

The LDS church considers the Judeo-Christian Bible subordinate to their written doctrines which they consider "authorized scripture inspired by God" based upon claims that Joseph Smith Jr. was a prophet:

They consider the King James Bible as only part of the word of God as it is "correctly translated", and have added "The Doctrine of Covenants", the "Pearl of Great Price", and the "Book of Mormon" to the canon of what they consider "authorized scripture". (Articles of Faith of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints Article 8 - The Reorganized Church only accepts the "Book of Mormon" to be "authorized scripture".)

The LDS church also recognizes the continuation Joseph Smith Jr.'s prophetic mantle to his successors, including Brigham Young, and succeeding presidents of the LDS. The Bible is recognized as God's word, but with the caveat, "As far as it is translated correctly", which de-facto subordinates it to other Mormon "scripture" with no translation questions.

So according to them, every succeeding LDS president is considered a prophet and able to modify scripture to suit themselves. The Mormon church also concludes that their "Doctrine of Covenants", the "Pearl of Great Price", the "Book of Mormon" and their prophetical revelations supersede the Bible because:

"Who knows that even one verse of the Bible has escaped pollution, so as to convey the same sense now that it did in the original?" (*Orson Pratt's Works*, 1891 Pg. 218), and

"We believe the Book of Mormon to be the Word of God" (*Articles of Faith of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints* Article 8)

The Mormon publication called the *Doctrine and Covenants* is supposed to be a record of 138 new revelations received by Joseph Smith Jr supposedly from God revealing some of Mormonism's distinctive doctrines such as baptism for the dead and celestial marriage.

The Book of Mormon claims the correct translation of the Bible is impossible since the Catholic Church has taken away the word of God:

"...many parts which are plain and most precious; and also many covenants of the Lord have they taken away. And all his have they taken away. And all this have they done that they might pervert the right ways of the Lord." (1 Nephi 13:26b,27)

The Mormon Church has always held the position that they alone represent true Christianity. Their leaders have consistently taught that after the death of the apostles, true Christianity fell into complete apostasy, making it necessary for a "restoration." Mormon Apostle Bruce R. McConkie, on page 513 of his book *Mormon Doctrine*, writes, "Mormonism is Christianity; Christianity is Mormonism ... Mormons are true Christians." In 1995 Mormon Apostle Dallin Oaks stated that the differences between "other Christian churches" and the LDS Church "explain why we send missionaries to other Christians" (*Ensign*, May 1995, 84).

Judeo-Christian Church History

The Bible and Christian church fathers confirm that special revelations ceased with the end of the New Testament. Anyone, including Joseph Smith Jr, or any LDS successor, who claim to have new visions, revelations, or inspired writings from God violate the biblically stated prohibition against such new teachings, and ignore the teachings of the church through the centuries. In other words, God said there would be no new revelations and that others would come claiming they had them:

In Revelation 22:18-19 Jesus said, "I testify to everyone who hears the words of the prophecy of this book: if anyone adds to them, God will add to him the plagues that are written in this book."; and

Jesus warned us by saying to His disciples: Luke 17:1-2 that: "It is inevitable that stumbling blocks come, but woe to one through whom they come! It is better for him if a millstone is hung around his neck and he is thrown into the sea, than that he may cause one of these little ones to sin."; and

In Matthew 24:23-24 Jesus warned: "Then if anyone says to you, 'Look, here is the Christ!' or 'There!' do not believe it. For false christs and false prophets will rise and show great signs and wonders to deceive, if possible, even the elect."

According to Jesus Himself, Joseph Smith Jr. was not a prophet, nor have any of his successors been prophets. According to statements made by in the Judeo-Christian Bible that anyone can plainly read for themselves, God has not inspired any additional revelations beyond what's written in the Judeo-

Christian Bible. For the past 21 centuries the Christian church has recognized no inspired writings later than the apostolic period because, as Jesus Himself said, there wouldn't be any.^{xiii}

With that said, do you believe that Joseph Smith's claims that his revelations were really given to him by God? At this point, it seems more likely that Joseph Smith Jr. wasn't a 15-year-old prophet, but a fraud.

Let's recap:

- 1. Smith claims to have seen a vision of God the Father and Son, then later, an angel names Moroni who gives him Golden Plates. He alone saw the vision and the Plates are never seen by anyone other than Smith. Then he claims the angel Moroni took them back to heaven.
- 2. Joseph Smith Jr had a long history in the occult using divinations and Seer stones to find things that were never found except for his tools which he likely knew where they were.
- 3. Isaac Hale, Joseph Smith's father-in-law, considered Smith to be a fraud. and saw him using the Seer stones while dictating the Book of Mormon to his wife from behind a curtain. She never saw the Plates and neither did he.
- 4. Martin Harris's wife considered Smith to be a fraud and left her husband during a period of time when divorce was very uncommon unless it was under grave circumstances.
- 5. Martin Harris gets duped and claims the "Reformed Egyptian" Smith translated into the Book of Mormon, now considered an inspired canon, was confirmed by Professor Charles Anton. Anton profusely denies he ever verified anything other than a farmer getting scammed.
- 6. Emma Smith took six months to finally agree to be a convert to the Mormon Church after severe pressure from Smith. Was the first scribe of the Book of Mormon savvy to Smith's elaborate scheme then caved to pressure from her husband?
- 7. None of Joseph Smith's treasure hunting buddies joined the Mormon Church. Perhaps they knew his reputation best.
- 8. The Rochester Newspapers reviewed the book under the headlines: "Blasphemy!". That is because what was written was not Christian doctrine well recognized by the other area inhabitants.
- 9. This is the same Joseph Smith Jr. who had become proficient in "Peep" stone seeing and known for his divination skills thanks in part to a traveling Magician who was looking for buried treasure with the help of his "Peep" stones. The same one who married Emma Hale, was found guilty of "glass gazing" (peeping Tom) based upon the original court bill of 1826 charging of him this offense.^{xiv} Rev. Wesly P. Walters found documentation for this suit recently, in 1971 in the basement of the courthouse. One of the witnesses testifying against him was Isaac Hale, father of his wife Emma.¹¹
- 10. Also, Joseph Smith was subjected to approximately thirty criminal actions during his life. Another source reports that Smith was arrested at least 42 times, including in the states of New York, Ohio, Missouri, and Illinois.

Mormons consider that Joseph Smith was chosen by God to usher in the restored gospel. Non-Mormons view him as having founded another church apart from Christianity. Mormons justify following Joseph Smith despite major character flaws by saying they don't expect a prophet to be perfect, and their church embodies the true gospel despite the human foibles of its leaders, members, and prophets alike. Non-Mormons ask how Mormons can justify following a leader who has historically displayed such questionable integrity in his words and deeds.^{xv}

How much does the personal character of your leaders matter in any organization, especially a church? When it comes to God, it matters plenty. According to 1 Timothy 3:8-13:

"Likewise deacons must be reverent, not double-tongued, not given to much wine, not greedy for money, holding the mystery [hidden truth] of the faith with a pure conscience. But let these also first be tested; then let them serve as deacons, being found blameless. Likewise, their wives must be reverent, not [malicious gossips] slanderers, temperate, faithful in all things. Let deacons be the husbands of one wife, ruling their children and their own houses well. For those who have served well as deacons obtain for themselves a good standing and great boldness in the faith which is in Christ Jesus."

The Catholic church did not pollute the original manuscripts, they corrupted church governance and practices that were not Biblical. In 1517, Martin Luther in his 95 theses or statements critiqued what he saw as teachings that led Christians astray. Never were any essentials to the Christian covenants ever taken away. In fact, the Protestant Reformation firmly established and affirmed the practice of following what the Bible actually says.

There is more evidence for the Bible's authenticity than for any literature of antiquity.^{xvi} The New Testament was written in first century A.D. by eye witnesses or those who heard the account from them. There are some 25,000 original early manuscripts in existence, almost 6,000 of which (many being only recognizable fragments) are Greek texts and the others being early translations of the Greek New Testament. The earliest textual evidence we have was copied not long after the originals.

The Old Testament has been more accurately transmitted to us than any other ancient writing of comparable age. The textual evidence is greater for both the Old and New Testaments than any other historically reliable ancient document. The ancient scribes were very meticulous. There were only 1,200 variant readings in 500 A.D.

The Masorites produced an official text in 500 A.D.. There are other versions that confirm the accuracy of the Masoretic Text:

- Samaritan Pentateuch: 400 B.C.
- Septuagint Greek: 280 B.C.
- Dead Sea Scrolls: 0 A.D.
- Latin Vulgate: 400 A.D.

Mormon Doctrine Compared to Judeo-Christianity

There is a vast difference between Mormon and Christian terminology and the associated doctrines. Ex-Mormons who have left the LDS church and accepted Jesus as their Lord and Savior can immediately recognize these deceptive tactics Mormons deploy. They use the same vocabulary as Christians when discussing subjects like salvation, grace, and atonement, but the meanings behind them are "miles apart."

Millions of Mormons have left The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints (LDS) when they were exposed to the real Jesus of the Judeo-Christian Bible. I have included analogies with my other research that highlights serious conflicts between Mormonism and Christianity.

The following table states Mormon doctrine based on Mormon publications considered as Mormon canon, as well as Mormon doctrinal references by Bruce R. Even in the celestial kingdom, godhood is a by slow progression, and in the end each who becomes a god will, with his family rule and populate a separate planet of his own."

"All the kingdoms of glory-whether celestial, terrestrial, or telestial-are sometimes called heaven." (Bruce R. McConkie, "Mormon Doctrine" Pg.348) The celestial kingdom is highest of the three and is gained by complete obedience to the Mormon gospel. There are also three degrees within the Celestial kingdom and marriage in a LDS temple is necessary to obtain the highest of that world (Bruce R. McConkie, "Mormon Doctrine" Pgs.116-117; also see D. & C. 132:20). The terrestrial kingdom is basically for: (A) those who accept the Mormon gospel in the spirit world through "temple ordinances" for the dead, yet a lack or some particular circumstance kept them from being heirs of the celestial kingdom; (B) honorable men of the earth who do not accept and live the Mormon

When Paul says that he went to the third heaven, <u>2 Corinthians 12:1-2</u> he means that he went to the place where God dwells – the third heaven. The first heaven refers to our sky where the clouds and atmosphere (aerial heavens) are located (Deut.28:12; Ps.147:8; Acts 14:17; James 5:18). The second heaven is the universe where the sun, moon and stars rotate (Gen. 15:5, Deut.1:10, Isa.13:10). The third heaven is the habitation (or throne) of God (Isa.66:1), the abode of angels (Matt. 18:10, 22:30), and where all those who have received Christ will go (Heb.9:15, 24, 12:22-23; Rev.21:1-4, 10-27). When a born-again believer in Jesus Christ dies, they are immediately in the presence of God in the third heaven. (2 Corinthians 5:6-8)

There are only two abodes: everlasting punishment or life eternal (<u>Matt.25:31-46</u>). Summary

The LDS church recruits new members into their church. Many join not knowing that the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints (LDS) is not a Christian denomination, and that their doctrines conflict with mainstream Christianity. These distortions of Biblical Christianity has led millions astray from the truth of God's love and salvation through the real Jesus Christ. Mormons are following a false christ. Jesus is not the brother of Satan; He is the second person of the Trinity. Jesus did not atone for our sins in the garden of Gethsemane as Mormonism teaches.^{xvii} Instead, he died for all our sins on the cross (<u>1</u> Peter 2:24).

Based upon these Mormon doctrinal errors that severely conflict with Biblical Judeo-Christianity, the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints is not a Christian denomination, but nothing more than a cult that uses Christian terminology.^{xviii} I know that this revelation may be shocking to you, as it has been for many who have already left the LDS church, but Mormonism is most definitely not Christianity, and has deceived millions of people worldwide.

The Bible says to "Be diligent to present yourself approved to God, a worker who does not need to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth." (2 Timothy 2:15 NKJV) Rightly dividing means accurately interpreting and applying what the original text you've just read is saying for yourself. When you do, you will know in your heart no matter how painful this reality is, that the LDS church teaches non-Christian, heretical doctrines that are in direct contradiction to the essentials of the Judeo-Christian faith, and they deny the true nature of God, of Jesus Christ, and the true path to salvation.

The Apostle Paul warned the church in Corinth in his second letter <u>2 Corinthians 11:3-4</u> saying "But I fear, lest somehow, as the serpent deceived Eve by his craftiness, so your minds may be corrupted from

the simplicity that is in Christ. For if he who comes preaches another Jesus whom we have not preached, or if you receive a different spirit which you have not received, or a different gospel which you have not accepted—you may well put up with it!"

If you are still in doubt, I would strongly encourage you to reach out to <u>exmormonsforjesus.org</u>. It is impossible to find the truth unless you have the courage and accurate resources to do so.

Consider This...

Mormonism is preventing their members from receiving eternal salvation as promised by Jesus Himself by refusing to acknowledge His power to save through His deity:

"Jesus answered and said to him, "Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God." (John 3:3)

"Jesus said to him, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me." (John 14:6)

"For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life." (John 3:16)

The LDS church is also denying the existence of the Holy Spirit which is further debilitating as well as blasphemes:

"but he who blasphemes against the Holy Spirit never has forgiveness, but is subject to eternal condemnation" (Mark 3:29)

"And anyone who speaks a word against the Son of Man, it will be forgiven him; but to him who blasphemes against the Holy Spirit, it will not be forgiven." (Luke 12:10)

"But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all things that I said to you." (John 14:26)

Being transformed into a new creation in Christ Jesus has been happening to people for centuries. The Apostle Peter, who was an eye witness to Jesus's ministry, His death and resurrection, said: "*Repent, and let every one of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.*"

Don't put up with lies, false prophets, and deception. Take a look at the next section and consider the cult patterns displayed in the LDS church.

Control Tactics

There are <u>6 warning signs displayed by religious cults</u>. One of the methods cults use with their followers is to isolate them and reinforce control through the threat of shunning. They inflict pain on members who leave through social rejection both at the church and family/friend levels and is meant to be a deterrent. Some religions such as Islam will murder friends and family should they choose to leave the faith. They also use torcher, beheadings, and threats of violence to convert others to Islam as displayed in the 56 Islamic crusades attacking primarily Christian or Jewish communities, and the recent jihadist movements like ISIS.

Perhaps they are afraid their member might leave the church after discovering the true gospel of Jesus Christ, and the ramifications for categorically denying the deity of Christ, and the person of the Holy Spirit. It takes bravery to turn away from a cult and embrace Christianity by accepting Jesus as Lord and Savior. This very personal decision will have earthly and eternal ramifications. Former cult members have been successful in opening the minds of family and friends through asking pointed questions concerning conflicting doctrines. It takes courage, but remember, everyone of your family and friend's eternal life depends on knowing the truth and being set free from this cult.

Ways that Mormons Engage in Shunning

Here are just a few ways the LDS church shuns former members who leave the church or question their authority:

- 1. **Shunned from family/friend activities:** Mandatory to shun people from weddings, baby blessings, and other key religious milestones. You have to show a Temple ID card. They actually check for these cards at the wedding venue door, so if you don't have one you can't get in.
- 2. **Cannot ''affiliate'' with an ''Individual'' who opposes LDS teachings:** Every 2 years Mormons must swear in a private meeting with a Bishop that they will not "affiliate" with "individuals" that do not agree with the teachings of the church. Most Mormons universally ignore this, though some can take it as a license. This biennial interrogation is to renew the Temple ID card which expires every 2 years.
- 3. Women; shun your husbands: Women cannot get into top level VIP heaven unless their husband makes it. Basically the woman goes to whatever heaven her husband goes to. So if a Mormon man leaves the church this teaching encourages her to divorce him because now she's not going to top level VIP heaven.
- 4. **Shunning through discipline**: If you are honest and confess to sin considered grievous, the Bishop (aka Elder, Pastor) can give you a public punishment. It could be one or all of the following. Cannot partake of bread & water, Cannot pray, Cannot answer a question in church even if asked directly, May not speak at church, Cannot bless anyone or anything, Cannot attend a wedding or other important thing you might want to do and if they can punish you they will. So basically you're wearing a Scarlet Letter for however long the punishment is (usually a few months but up to a year or five, it's always open ended and goes until the Bishop feels like you have been sufficiently humiliated). Everyone will assume you are an adulterer or worse.
- 5. **Expulsion from Church School:** Probably one of the most sinister forms of shunning. Church schools require students to obtain an ecclesiastical endorsement from their local Bishop. The endorsement is on contingency that the student comply with a list of Honor Code rules, and open to the interpretation of each Bishop. These rules include no alcohol, no being alone with the opposite sex, no tobacco, strict dress code, and a number of other petty rules. The endorsement can be revoked at any time for breaking the Honor Code. Once the endorsement is revoked the following shunning actions will happen:
 - a. Student is expelled from school
 - b. Fired from school job
 - c. Evicted from student housing

While the LDS church formally states that they do not shun, It is clear based upon the personal experiences of people who have left the church that shunning in some form does happen. <u>Click here</u> to read about the shunning experiences others have had.

Salvation and eternal life is available to all no matter what their background, level of sin, gender, or color is. God so loved the world and sent His only Son Jesus to die for the remission of our sins that keep us separated from a holy God. If your heart is ready, here is the true path to God. His arms are always open to receive you. Jesus said "Behold, I stand at the door and knock; if anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and will dine with him, and he with Me." Revelation 3:20

The Road to Salvation for All

Yes, the often-repeated phrase - Jesus Saves – is true. I want to introduce you to the real Jesus. You can become born again in Christ Jesus and filled with the Holy Spirit from the privacy of your home, car, bathroom, or closet. God knows your heart. If you're ready to receive Jesus as your Lord and Savior, there is no time to lose. Do it now because your life can end unexpectantly.

The Salvation Prayer is recited from the heart by anyone who wants to become a born-again child of God. There are four steps in the prayer process: A) repent of your sins, B) ask God for forgiveness of your sins, C) state that you believe in the life, death, and saving resurrection of Jesus Christ, and D) Ask Jesus to be your Lord, and to be filled with the Holy Spirit of God.

Here is the scriptural references for praying the sinner's prayer. Follow these steps and pray to God from your heart. He will hear your prayers:

Admit you are a sinner:

Throughout our lives we have all made mistakes.

- *"There is none righteous, no, not one;* (Romans 3:10)
- *"for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God,"* (Romans 3:23)
- "But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." (Roams 5:8)
- *"For the wages of sin is death, but the ^[a]gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."* (Romans 6:23)

Ask God's forgiveness and repent of your sins:

- *"Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved"* Romans 10:13
- *"Repent therefore and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out, so that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord,"* (Acts 3:19)

Believe in Jesus:

Put your trust in Him as your only hope of salvation:

- "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life." (John 3:16)
- "Jesus said to him, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me." (John 14:6)

Become a child of God by receiving Christ:

• "But as many as received Him, to them He gave the ^[a]right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name" (John 1:12)

• "Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and dine with him, and he with Me." (Revelation 3:20)

Confess Jesus is your Lord:

• "that if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation." (Romans 10:9-10)

A Simple Prayer from the Heart

Dear Father,

I now believe that Jesus Christ is Your only begotten Son, that He came down to our earth in the flesh born of a virgin, and died on the cross to take away all my sins and the sins of this world. I believe in my heart that Jesus Christ rose from the dead on the third day to give all of us eternal life.

Lord Jesus,

I confess to You all the wrong and sinful things that I have ever done in my life. I ask that You please forgive me and wash away all my sins by the blood that You have personally shed for me on the cross. I accept You as my personal Lord and Savior. I ask that You come into my life, fill me with the Holy Spirit and live with me for all of eternity – make me into the person that you created me to be.

In Jesus name! Amen!

Congratulations! The act of repentance and faith in Christ gives the lost person new birth (born-again), and entrance into the Kingdom of God. This is a huge happening! Luke 15:10 tells us, "... *There is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner that repents.*" Why is this a cause for rejoicing? Because you have become a child of God, avoided eternal separation from God in hell, and will forever reside with Him in heaven immediately (2 Corinthians 5:8) after you leave this earth.

Making a commitment to Jesus and becoming a child of God is the first step in a life-long journey of getting to know God personally, and learning about thousands of promises he made in the Bible to prosper, support, love and encourage you, His child. In the following section we will review your next steps.

What Now?

Step 1 - Find a Christian Church

You will first need to find a reputable Christian church that practices doctrinal Christianity. First, we must differentiate between denominations within the body of Christ and non-Christian cults and other religions. Mormons, and as we have demonstrated, as well as Jehovah's Witnesses, are examples of cults (groups claiming to be Christian but denying one of more of the essentials of the Christian faith).

As you search for a Christian Church, you will find many different denominations. The rise of denominations in the Christian faith can be traced back to Martin Luther and the Protestant Reformation of the Catholic church during the 16th century. Out of this, four major division of Protestantism would emerge: Lutheran, Reformed, Anabaptist, and Anglican. These four were the root that other denominations grew from over the centuries.

Denominationalism is not found anywhere in scripture. The Bible says that we are the body of Christ with a mandate for unification and connectivity. The doctrines taught by the church you are considering must adhere to commonly accepted Judeo-Christian principles taught in the Bible. We have one God, and one Bible.

Review the Statement of Faith from the church you are considering. It will declare the church's position on matters that pertain to the essentials of Biblical Christianity. Every church you research prior to attending should have these same basic statements of what they stand for. If you don't see a statement similar to the ones on this list, ask that church's pastor for a clarification:

- They believe that the Bible is inspired by God in its entirety, and is without error in the original manuscripts, and is a complete and final written revelation from God. (<u>2 Timothy 3:15-17, 2</u> <u>Peter 1:21</u>)
- 2. They believe that there is only one God, who is eternal and immutable, and manifests Himself in three distinct Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. (Genesis 1:1, Deuteronomy 6:4, Matthew 28:19, John 10:30)
- 3. They believe that Jesus of Nazareth is the promised Messiah (John 1:36-42), born of a virgin (Isaiah 7:14, Matthew 1:23, Luke 1:34-35), totally without sin (Hebrews 4:15, Hebrews 7:26), God in human flesh (John 1:1 & 14, John 20:28) the One Who died on the cross for our sins (1 Corinthians 15:3, Ephesians 1:7, Hebrews 2:9), was buried (John 19:40-42), rose again from the dead on the third day (John 2:19), and ascended to the right hand of the Father in heaven, where He now intercedes for us who believe in Him. (Mark 16:19, Acts 7:56, 1 Timothy 2:5)
- 4. They believe that Jesus Christ is going to return in the clouds for His church before the tribulation that is coming upon the whole earth (<u>1 Thessalonians 4:16</u>), and that He will return with His saints and all His holy angels to the earth at the end of the tribulation, and set up His kingdom on earth, ruling and reigning forever and ever. (<u>Matthew 24:30, Revelation 19:13</u>)
- 5. They believe that all humanity is lost and born with a sinful nature, and can only be saved by a personal faith in the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, and not by any human merit or performance. (John 3:16-19, John 5:24, Romans 3:10, Romans 3:23, Romans 5:8-9, Ephesians 2:8-10, Titus 3:5)
- 6. They believe in a real/literal devil, called Satan, who, along with all his fallen angels that became demons, and evil spirits, are destined to spend eternity in hell, and now seek to deceive the world, defeat the believers, and destroy the work of God, but can be resisted by believers, who are protected by God, the Holy Spirit, and the intercession of Jesus Christ our Lord. (Genesis 3:1, Job 1:6-12, Matthew 4:1-11, Luke 10:18-19, Luke 22:31-32, 1 John 4:4, Revelation 20:10)
- 7. They believe that heaven is a real place where the saved will dwell forever, and that hell is a literal place of torment where unbelievers (those who have not accepted Jesus as Lord and Savior) will suffer forever. (John 14:1-3, Revelation 20:11-15, Revelation 21:8, Revelation 22:5)

- They believe that genuine believers are born again by the Holy Spirit of God, and are indwelt, baptized into the body of Christ, the true church, and sealed by the Holy Spirit, and thus, unable to be separated from the love of Jesus Christ. (John 3:1-6, Acts 1:4-5, Romans 8:35-39, Ephesians 1:13-14)
- They believe that all believers need to be filled and empowered by the Holy Spirit to live a godly life and to be bold in our witness for the Lord. (<u>Romans 8:13-14, 1 Corinthians 3:16, 1</u> Corinthians 6:19-20, Ephesians 4:30, Ephesians 5:18)
- They believe in the spiritual unity of all genuine believers in the Lord Jesus Christ which is manifested by the spiritual gifts and fruit of the Holy Spirit's presence through His love. (<u>I</u> <u>Corinthians 12:12-13</u>, <u>Galatians 5:22-23</u>, <u>Ephesians 4:8-12</u>)
- 11. They believe that the nation of Israel has a special place in God's plan, and that all the promises of God to Israel will be fulfilled both now and in the Second Coming of Jesus Christ in His millennium. (Genesis 12:3, Psalm 122:1)
- 12. They believe the human race was created as male and female by a direct act of God to fully reveal His image. (Genesis 1:26-28)
- 13. They believe marriage is a sacred covenantal union between a man and a woman that limits sexual relations to monogamous, heterosexual marriage. (Genesis 2:24)
- 14. They believe that the solemnizing of a marriage is a sacred and profound event that shall be entered into only where the proposed covenantal union is in compliance with the Word of God. (Genesis 4:1)
- 15. They believe that the solemnizing of a marriage between men and women of the same sex is contrary to the Word of God and is a sin before God. (Romans 1:21-27)
- 16. They believe in the sanctity of human life in all stages from conception to natural death. The church, based upon clear biblical teaching and by obedience to the Holy Scriptures, must believe that life is to be preserved without exception. (Psalm 82:3-4, Genesis 1:27, Psalm 127, 3, Exodus 20-13, Exodus 20:13, Micah 6:7, John 10:10)
- 17. They believe in the standard of holy living set forth in Holy Scripture and agree that as believers in the Lord we must adhere to right living preserving our witness before the unsaved world. We agree that we are living sacrifices, holy and acceptable to God and that without the Holy Spirit's indwelling and recurring filling for Christian power, we cannot fully display Christ. (Romans 12:1, 1 Peter 2:5)

Don't be afraid to ask questions if you don't see some of these statements listed on their website. It's critical that you find a great church that has solid, Biblically based teaching so that you can grow in your knowledge of the Lord and be properly taught. When you attend, pray. You should feel the presence of the Holy Spirit in their worship and within their congregation. Let them know you are a new believer attending for the first time.

Step 2 - Water Baptism

Once you have found a church, verified their statement of faith meets doctrinal Christian standards, and feel comfortable with the people and the leadership, it is time to get water baptized. It is important to do this as quickly as you can after your procession of faith. Christian baptism is one of two ordinances that Jesus instituted for the church. Just before His ascension, Jesus said, "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age" (Matthew 28:19–20).

Baptism is the physical representation of the death of your old self when you are dunked under the water, and when you emerge from under the water, this represents your new born again life that has been cleansed from sin. Many churches have water baptisms on campus after their weekly service, or schedule them monthly. Some even hold baptisms in pools, or in the ocean. Schedule your baptism as quickly as possible.

Step 3 - Baptism of the Holy Spirit

Just before Jesus' death, He told His disciples that He would not leave them as orphans but send a helper - The Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is the third person or representation of God that we are filled with at the point of our salvation, and then anointed by Him through the baptism of the Holy Spirit.

When you accepted Jesus as Lord the Spirit of God placed you into union with Christ and union with other believers in the body of Christ at the moment of salvation. (<u>Mark 1:8</u>) After you have been water baptized, there is a second baptism of the Holy Spirit.

Baptism of the Holy Spirit is a separate experience. (Acts 8:14-21, 19:5-6) The baptism in the Holy Spirit is the doorway to experiencing God in your life and must be received by faith. Receiving the Holy Spirit is so important to the Lord that He commanded the apostles who had already accepted Him as Lord not to go anywhere until they have received the Spirit (Luke 24:49, Acts 1:4).

Jesus revealed the purpose of the baptism in <u>Acts chapter 1:5 & 8</u>:

• "For John truly baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now... YOU SHALL RECEIVE POWER when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth."

The purpose of the Holy Spirit coming upon the believer is to receive power for service. When you are filled with the Spirit, you literally receive the power and ability through gifts of God to carry out the commission to be His witness.

The Holy Spirit is one of three personifications of God – Father, Son (Jesus) and Holy Spirit. The power of the Holy Spirit gives us the willpower and strength to live a Christian life, but also gives us gifts and abilities according to His will and selection.

In <u>1 Corinthians 12:4-10</u> it says:

• "There are diversities of gifts, but the same Spirit. There are differences of ministries, but the same Lord. And there are diversities of activities, but it is the same God who works all in all. But

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the manifestation of the Spirit is given to each one for the profit of all: for to one is given the word of wisdom through the Spirit, to another the word of knowledge through the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healings by the same Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another discerning of spirits, to another different kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues."

In <u>Romans 8:26-27</u> it says:

• "Likewise the Spirit also helps in our weaknesses. For we do not know what we should pray for as we ought, but the Spirit Himself makes intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered. Now He who searches the hearts knows what the mind of the Spirit is, because He makes intercession for the saints according to the will of God."

The second main reason that you will want this gift is so that you can have God's supernatural power flowing through you so you can fully accomplish the plan God's perfect will gave you to execute in this life. This is where you really enter what is called your anointing.

Find the elders in your church and ask them to pray over you for the anointing of the Holy Spirit.

Step 4 – Follow the Basics of a Christian Life

Your relationship with the Lord will grow substantially over time. The depth of which will totally depend on your level of commitment to building your personal relationship with God. A relationship with God is just like others in life. You must be engaged daily for it to grow.

Here are some tips to grow in your relationship with God:

- Fully Surrender: This means that after you pray the salvation prayer, you are committed to completely surrendering your life to God. Jesus must become your Lord over your life and not just your Savior. When you prayed the prayer of salvation, you entered a blood covenant relationship with God by accepting the shed blood sacrifice of Jesus that cleanses you of all unrighteousness and comes with several promises God made to us in scripture. Pray often to seek His will. (Matthew 6:33)
- 2. Become Spirit-Filled: You received the Holy Spirit when you were saved. However, after you have your water baptism, you need to receive the Baptism of the Holy Spirit. This step puts your relationship with God into overdrive. You cannot live a Christian life without the power of the Holy Spirit guiding and empowering you. One of the many things the Holy Spirit will do for you is guide you in all truth and teach you all things. <u>1 Corinthians 12:7-11</u> tells us "But the manifestation of the Spirit is given to each one for the profit of all: for to one is given the word of wisdom through the Spirit, to another the word of knowledge through the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healings by ^[1]the same Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another discerning of spirits, to another different kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. But one and the same Spirit works all these things, distributing to each one individually as He wills." Pray about receiving and applying your gifts.
- **3.** Establish Faith and Trust in God: <u>Proverbs 3:5-6</u> says to "trust in the Lord with all our heart and lean not on our own understanding. In all our ways we acknowledge Him, and He will direct

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our paths. "Faith is the currency of heaven. Every miracle Jesus performed required faith from the recipient in Him. God loves you and has a plan for your life. He has written down more that 2,000 promises in the Bible that belong to every believer who have a covenant relationship with God through Jesus Christ. You do your part, and God will do His. <u>Matthew 6:33</u> says: "*But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you.*" These "things" come to you depending on your readiness to receive them. Be patient. Trust God and leave all the consequences to Him.

- 4. Walk in all of God's Ways: The best way to begin this journey is to read God's word every day and learn His rules. You should get started with a basic daily Bible reading plan. There are several available through the free You Version Bible app. The icon is a reddish square with the words "Holy Bible" written on the front. It is available in IOS and Droid formats. Start off with a plan that takes you through the Bible in a year. The app will organize your daily reading plan. Once you register, you can invite other people you know to join you in the plan you selected. It is important to know the character and person of God. Get into a Bible study group at your church and participate in discipleship programs to build your understanding of God's word and how to live a life that glorifies Him.
- **5. Develop a Good Personal Relationship with the Lord:** Talk to God about everything. Jesus said, "I will never leave you nor forsake you." Learn to recognize His presence in your daily life. Talk to Him about your concerns, questions, fears, problems, or even what road to take to the market. That last statement may sound crazy, but I can't tell you how many times I avoided an accident, or hours of traffic, by listening to His small quiet voice, or following the idea that just so happened to pop into my brain after I prayed.
- 6. Develop a Good, Strong, Prayer Life with the Lord: James 5:16 says that "*The effective*, ^[b]*fervent prayer of a righteous man [or woman] avails much.*" A critical part to prayer is knowing God's promises through Bible study, and memorizing poignant scriptures that can be applied to everyday life. Always be having a discussion with the Lord. He wants to hear about your hopes, dreams, problems, and requests for interceding in your life.
- 7. Memorize Scripture: Hiding God's word is critical to your growth as a Christian and in your prayer life. These memorized scriptures become offensive and defensive weapons in prayer and in protecting your mind from destructive or demoralizing thoughts. "Your word I have hidden in my heart, That I might not sin against You." (Psalm 119:11); "Keep your heart with all diligence For out of it spring the issues of life" (Proverbs 4:23); "My son [daughter] do not forget my law But let your heart keep my commands." (Proverbs 3:1). Each verse instructs us to learn what not to do; feed your heart with God's word so it flows with His love and wisdom; and by continual repetitious study, be reminded of His commands.
- 8. Enter a True Sanctification Process with the Lord: "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is [she is] a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new." (2 Corinthians 5:17) None of us is perfect. Your transformation in some areas will be instant, while others will require gradual refinement. Jesus was the only perfect person to walk the earth, that's why He needed to die to save us. All of us have the tendency to sin. We were born with a sin nature that can only be controlled through the power of the Holy Spirit, the depth and commitment in your personal relationship with God, combined with your knowledge of scripture. As your relationship with the Lord deepens, He will cause you to recall areas or issues

in your life you need to adjust or surgically remove. Through this process you may find toxic relationships or unhealthy habits you will need to step away from.

- 9. Seek after the Knowledge of God: May your seeking the knowledge of God become a daily habit. "Then you will understand the fear of the Lord, and find the knowledge of God." (Proverbs 2:5) "So I say to you, ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you." (Luke 11:9) Seeking God's knowledge will become a lifelong journey filled with discovery. Pray as you read and ask Him, "what lesson should I learn from this verse or passage of scripture?" You will be amazed at the insight God will reveal to you. These insights, and the Holy Spirit discernment that follows, will give you an advantage in life.
- 10. Establish Good Personal Relationships with Other Christians: Use the discernment the Holy Spirit gives you when establishing relationships with other Christians. I regret to say that there are far too many people who label themselves Christian, yet have no personal relationship with God, or worst yet, feel that since they are American or member of a particular church, makes them a Christian. *"Therefore by their fruits you will know them."* Matthew 7:20 *"A good tree cannot bear bad fruit, nor can a bad tree bear good fruit."* Matthew 7:18 Fruit means what their life and lifestyle produces. Choose people whose life consistently demonstrates a Godly and moral character. Surround yourself with Godly people who you can learn from.
- 11. Join a Good Spirit-Filled Church: This is extremely important. Follow the church selection steps discussed early and dig in. Find a ministry you enjoy and volunteer. Look for opportunities to register for discipleship classes that can help you grow in your knowledge of God's word. Understand why you believe what you believe and be able to defend your position. "But sanctify [set apart as holy] the Lord God in your hearts, and always be ready to give a defense to everyone who asks you a reason for the hope [faith] that is in you, with meekness [power under control] and fear [reverence and respect];" (1 Peter 3:15) There are several good Christian Apologetics books and articles that address ways to understand and defend your Christian faith.
